### **Branch Meeting, November 10**

The Mt. Vernon Branch of AAUW will hold its November meeting on Thursday, November 10, from 7:00 – 9:00 at the Mt. Vernon Government Center on Parkers Lane in Alexandria.

Our speaker is a noted Middle East scholar, **Dr. Malcolm Peck**, who will present "The Impact of the Arab Spring on the Role of Women in Arab Cultures: Evolution or Status-Quo." Dr. Peck, educated at Harvard University (BA and MA) and the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy (MA, MALD, and Ph.D.), has taught at the University of Chattanooga (now the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga); was a post-doctoral fellow at the Harvard University Center for Middle Eastern Studies; and, from 1970 to 1981, was assistant to the president and director of programs at the Middle East Insti-

tute in Washington, D.C. He served as the Arabian Peninsula affairs analyst at the U.S. Department of State from 1981 to 1983. Dr. Peck has written on Persian/Arabian Gulf and Arabian Peninsula issues in chapters contributed to nine books and in a number of articles. He is the author of *The United Arab Emirates: A Venture in Unity* (1986) as well as the *Historical Dictionary of the Gulf Arab States* (1997) and is a contributor to *Arabies Trends*, the *Encyclopedia of the Modern Middle East, Microsoft Encarta,* and *The World Book.* Peck is a co-founder and secretary of the Society for Gulf Arab Studies.

The women were labeled traitors to their country and treated accordingly. Of note, ignored by the anti-suffragists, were the slogans held by the picketers - all taken from speech's by President Wilson, using his words to promote democracy and freedom for all people's.

After the museum visit, everyone went to **Trish Smith's** home to watch the 2004 movie, "Iron Jawed Angels", with Angelica Huston and Hilary Swank, an HBO movie detailing the events we about which we had just learned. The synergy between the two program elements made for a great day.

This program year AAUW of Virginia is one of two states (California the other) that will be voting in the One Member One Vote initiative by having available to its members the voting ballot on-line. The Spring 2012 elections will include the election of officers, bylaws changes, and public policy approval.

Online voting has become an alternative to the paper ballot as a cost cutting measure. AAUW understands that many members may not have email addresses or be comfortable in voting online. Paper ballots and voter guides will be offered to those members.

This fall AAWU of Virginia will survey the membership who have email addresses about on line voting. Be sure to respond to this survey if you are comfortable

with online voting. If you wish to vote online, ask one of the tech savvy branch members for a tutorial or assistance in voting online. Either way your voice will be heard with One Member One Vote.

# **Empowered Women International**

On October 29, Empowered Women International, one of our community-outreach organizations, is hosting an open house to be followed by a concert of Sephardic music by Flory Jagoda, renowned Sephardic singer. Flory Jagoda was born into the musical Altaras family in Sarajevo, Bosnia and is known as the "Keeper of the Flame" for her steadfast commitment to continuing her family's musical heritage.

She has had a distinguished career as an international singer and composer of Sephardic music, one of Judaism's richest cultural traditions. These songs serve as a lyrical history of the Sephardim, the Spanish and Portuguese Jews who fled the Iberian Peninsula as a result of the Inquisition beginning in 1492. Many of these exiles settled in the Ottoman Empire, including the former Yugoslavia. Flory was honored with an NEA National Heritage Fellowship in September 2002 and served as a Master Artist in the Folklife Apprenticeship Program at the Virginia Foun-



dation for the Humanities. In March 2003 she was the soloist performer in a ceremony at Auschwitz, Poland, commemorating the Sephardim who perished there during the Holocaust. She is also the proud recipient of the 2003 Immigrant Achievement Award. Flory's music is circulated through 5 recordings and in The Flory Jagoda Songbook. A documentary about her life, *The Key From Spain*, has been featured in national and international film festivals.

Jagoda's recording *Kantikas Di Mi Nona* (Songs of My Grandmother) consists of songs her grandmother, a Sephardic folksinger, taught her as a young girl. Following the release of her second recording, *Memories of Sarajevo*, she recorded *La Nona Kanta* (The Grandmother Songs), songs she herself wrote for her grandchildren. Through stories and music, Flory, now 88, will share her immigration journey from Bosnia to the United States, and the stories of the Sephardic people she grew up with and met along her journey.
