

## **Branch Bylaws Changes**

### **Elaine Kolish**

Our branch board would like to propose the following two changes to our bylaws, and in accordance with the bylaws' requirements we are seeking the State bylaw chair or committee's approval. We plan to vote on this at the Annual Meeting, March 17.

The changes are noted below.

- · No officer shall hold more than one office at a time, and no elected officer shall be eligible to serve more than three (replacing two) consecutive terms in the same office.
- · Section 3. Branch Vote. Provisions of these bylaws not governed by the AAUW Bylaws may be amended at a branch meeting by a majority (replacing two-thirds) vote of those present and voting, provided written notice shall have been sent to the members at least 14 days prior to the meeting.



### **DID YOU HEAR?**

### The AAUW of Virginia Board is proposing to increase state dues to \$15!!



It's true. The word is out. State dues have not increased for AAUW of Virginia members for twenty years, but necessity offers us no alternative.

What used to cost \$8 in 1991 now costs more than \$13. The state board has stretched and stretched that \$8 until it can't be stretched anymore! We had to go into reserves this year to balance the budget. After great debate we determined that an increase to \$15 will mean that we won't have to consider another increase for some years.

When given the option in 2009, AAUW of Virginia members determined that having a state board was something you wanted to keep. Here are some reasons why:

- The state board is the link between National and the branches. We know how to get your questions and concerns to the right people at National. We make sure branches receive the resources you can use or know where to find them.
- The state board is a direct connection to the branches: a layer of support and assistance.
- The state website and Facebook page promote our branches to potential new members, especially younger women. We are "out there" for you!
- Through the publication of the *Vision* we provide a way to share branch programs, events and ideas. We inform members of state activities and national initiatives.
- The state lobbies in Richmond, representing more than 1300 members, which carries more weight than that of your individual branch or members.

We organize and provide state conferences where members and branch leaders can re-energize, learn, gather ideas, network, socialize, and feel the pride of being part of something bigger than ourselves.

# Public Policy





**AAUW Action Fund Launches 'It's My Vote' Campaign** Recently the **AAUW Action Fund** launched <a href="It's My Vote: I Will Be Heard">It's My Vote: I Will Be Heard</a>, a nonpartisan voter education and turnout effort that aims to maximize the electoral power of young women in the 2012 election. Eighteen- to 30-year-olds represent the largest generation since the baby boomers and present the strongest opportunity to increase voter turnout among women. As part of this national campaign, the **AAUW Action Fund** is providing grants to 15 target states to help them increase the influence of women in shaping public policy. (Virginia was one of these states!) The My Vote campaign will also focus on critical issues that affect women such as jobs, college affordability, and health care, including access to birth control.

"AAUW stands on a rich history of civic engagement and voter education," said AAUW Executive Director Linda D. Hallman, CAE. "We recognize the power of a single vote, and we will do everything we can to encourage all citizens to cast an informed ballot. Women must get involved in the political process to ensure that the issues they care about get the attention they deserve."

**AAUW** Action Fund Releases Congressional Voting Record This week, the AAUW Action Fund released a scorecard of members of Congress' action on issues that will be critical to women and their families when they cast their votes in the upcoming elections. The new <u>Congressional Voting Record</u>, which covers the first session of the 112th Congress, outlines how U.S. senators and representatives voted and whether they co-sponsored legislation on priority issues affecting education, economic security, and civil rights. "This voting record underscores the lack of action on women's issues and will be a powerful tool outside the Beltway," said Lisa Maatz, AAUW director of public policy and government relations.

## **Legal Advocacy Update**

### LAF Case Featured in Sundance Award-Winning Film The Invisible War

The Department of Defense estimates that about 19,000 military service women and men were sexually assaulted and raped in 2010. The widespread problem of sexual assault in the military is the subject of the new documentary *The Invisible War*. The documentary features several of the plaintiffs from the LAF-supported lawsuit *Cioca v. Rumsfeld*, including the lead plaintiff, Kori Cioca. It also features her attorney, Susan Burke. The documentary premiered at the Sundance Film Festival in January and earned the **Audience Award**.

LAF Program Manager Holly Kearl attended a screening and survivor speak-out, where she was able to meet with Cioca (see a photo on AAUW's blog). In an upcoming Program in a Box, AAUW members will learn what they can do to address the issue of military sexual assault. In the meantime, please contact your representative about the Sexual Assault Training Oversight and Prevention Act, donate to AAUW to help offset the legal costs of the lawsuit, and visit *The Invisible War's* website to learn about other actions you can take.


