Renew Dues by June 30: Avoid Increase Trish Smith

Renew your AAUW Membership by June 30, 2012 and you will receive the same rate as last year - \$70.

Although the \$7 dues increase hasn't been voted on yet, there was overwhelmingly positive talk about it at the recent state conference. If the increase does happen, it would go into effect on July 1, 2012, AFTER this year's dues are due.

PAY YOUR DUES NOW (ON TIME), BY JUNE 30, AND AVOID A POSSIBLE INCREASE!

Dues now are \$49 for National, \$8 for Virginia and \$13 for our branch. (The \$7 increase goes to Virginia.)

The quickest way to renew your membership is to pay online with a personal credit card.

Should you choose to mail your check to **Trish Smith**, **Treasurer**, (11806 Robertson Farm Circle, Fairfax, VA 22030) and want the \$70 rate, be sure to mail it so that Trish receives it <u>before</u> <u>June 30</u>. That way she will be able to go online and renew your membership at the \$70 rate.

Online Renewal:

Go to aauw.org. Click on **Member Center** and select **Member Services Database** from the drop down box. The Member Services Database page displays with Login Member ID and password fields. If you have not already created an account in the Member Services Database, click on **Register Here** and enter the requested contact details to verify your membership and create a password.

If you do not know your Member ID, click on the **Member ID Lookup** link located on this same page and then enter the information requested to view your member number. Upon completion, an e-mail will be sent from AAUW (e-online support) to your e-mail address, containing a secure link to complete your registration. Welcome to the MSD! (*Note: If this is unsuccessful, please e-mail <u>eonline-help@aauw.org</u> and provide your full name, your state, and the name of your branch or call 800/326-2289.)*

After logging into the database, scroll down the left side of the page and **Select Personal Membership MPP** and follow the remaining steps to renew your membership in AAUW. **Your Current Membership Status** shows your branch name, membership category, and current and new membership expiration dates.

The **Membership Renewal Dues Payment Process** section displays the amount due and the option to include a contribution. You can either print out an invoice and mail it to National with your check or use a credit card and pay online.

The **Payment Information** section is pre-populated with your contact information. You can type over this information to change the payment information.

Complete the credit card information then press **Submit** to review your entries. If correct, press **Submit** again; if not, press **Cancel** to return to the input screen and make corrections.

A confirmation of your membership renewal will be sent to your e-mail address for your records. A copy will also be sent to Trish Smith, Treasurer, for the Mt Vernon Branch records.

It was great seeing so many Northern District (ND) members at the State Conference. Below is an overview of the ND meeting. More information on the items below to follow.

1. **Sandra Wilson** (Vienna) is stepping down as District treasurer and **Nancy Thompson** (Reston-Herndon) has volunteered to take this position.

2. Several members (Ann Sauberman/Springfield-Annandale, Angela Booker/Woodbridge, Leslie Vandevere/Fairfax City, Nancy McKenzie/Greater Manassas) have volunteered to work on the George Mason University College /University (C/U) Partnership. We plan to meet during the summer to identify points of contacts at three GMU locations and develop an action plan. If you want to help, please contact me.

3. I proposed having district branch presidents meetings throughout the coming year. The goal is to exchange ideas and brain storm common challenges to make the ND branches stronger. I would like to have the first meeting late summer 2012.

4. Also discussed was a *district leadership meeting*, spring 2013, for current and incoming branch leaders. The goal is for each position to meet together to exchange ideas and information. State board members would be invited to

provide relevant training, foster ideas, and lead discussions.

5. Members brought up the idea of providing more information and awareness on branch leadership positions and possible training for potential branch leaders. The goal is to nurture and grow new leaders for branch and potentially other AAUW offices.

Five: One word, "Wisconsin" - Renee Kelling Barr, via Facebook

Four: Equal pay is an important election issue for multiple reasons. One, it raises tax revenue. Two, if you want to improve graduation rates for Americans, fair pay is a great incentive. Three, equal pay is necessary for healthy families that have women as the bread winners. — *Heather Mattioli, via Facebook*
