More and more often we are reading that headline. Have you noticed: Many of us are seniors; and did you realize we are all very vulnerable to scams?

Join us to learn how to avoid being caught in the trap.

Lisa Schifferle of the Federal Trade Commission will offer advice for individuals, families, and caregivers on ways to avoid scams that target seniors, as well as detecting the signs of fraud and identity theft when it has been perpetrated against older or vulnerable adults. Handouts will include the Federal Trade Commission's 10 Things You Can Do to Avoid Fraud, and a publication by Financial Service Roundtable's Older Americans Financial Abuse Prevention Working Group that includes links to programs on fraud prevention and an overview of tips for seniors and organizations working with older Americans.


