NOTES: AAUW STATE CONFERENCE

- 1. As of March 25, 2013, AAUW of Virginia membership totaled 1,311 branch members and 1,061 National Members in the state, for a grand total of 2,372.
- 2. The Keynote Speaker was **Dr. Karen Remly**, former VA State Commissioner of Health. She reported some good news. Life expectancy in VA has gone up since 1950 when it was 55, with positive changes influenced by government interventions regarding clean water, immunizations, seat belts, etc. Cancer and heart problems are declining. Suicide and drug related deaths are increasing. Stroke is still a problem. Lung cancer in older women is increasing. (How many of us smoked in college?) Infant mortality needs to be lower.

Free advice from Dr. Remley: Control your blood pressure. Lose weight, eat a Mediterranean Diet. Get your Blood Pressure checked at a pharmacy where it's free and you go there more frequently than a doctor's office. Lower your salt intake. Practice moderation in everything.

3. Our own **Patsy Quick**, known outside our branch as the AAUW State Vice President for Communications earned praise for co-presenting the workshop, Count Us

- In: Become a Website Wonder.
- 4. AAUW Vice President **Patricia Fae Ho** and VA State President **Caroline Pickens** conducted the workshop, Skinning the Cat: Many Ways to Lead. If traditional branch leadership positions are hard to fill, they suggest alternative models for running a branch, e.g., by Coordinating Committee, or by Task Force, or by Skills Team. Such alternatives do require much brain storming as one size does not fit all, and they require an amendment to the bylaws.
- 5. The next VA State Conference will be held April 4-6, 2014, at Smith Mountain Lake. Our VA Northern District will host the 2016 State Conference.
- 6. Thank you to all who donated fiber bags. They are now on their way to Africa to counter plastic bag pollution.
