What is an elevator speech?

An elevator speech is a quick summary of what AAUW is about – 30 seconds tops. The goal is to have the listener say "Tell me more!" That is exactly what happened to me. It was the "tell me more" that I had the problem with.

If I had it to do over again I would

have been prepared with an elevator speech and said something like this:

AAUW is a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization for women* graduates of 4 and 2 year colleges. AAUW examines and takes positions on fundamental issues of the day including education, social, economic, and political issues. Right now AAUW is focusing on pay equity. There are other significant issues that are important to women that are coming up that AAUW is focusing on. Each branch in the

country chooses the issues they want to concentrate on through their programs and activities.

This fall, for example, our branch is focusing on sexual harassment, STEM education, and staying safe in the digital age. But we're not all work and no play. We have a fabulous book group, a gourmet group and a Game Night group that includes husbands and significant others. We try to have something for everyone so that all can learn, contribute and be part of the group.
