We are particularly pleased to be supporting a local school that serves students from such diverse cultural backgrounds and with a high percentage of students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch. You will be hearing much more about this exciting plan in the future.

You will also soon be hearing details of our branch's **Visioning Project**. Led by trained workshop guides, Visioning helps AAUW branches look inward to analyze and imagine how to grow, change, and flourish as a branch.

Join us for an inspirational session on strategies to encourage young women to strive toward leadership and public service. The program will feature **Ms. Jessica Grounds**, co-founder of **Running Start** (www.runningstartonline.org), a Washington, DC-based non-profit that works with a variety of partner organizations, including AAUW, to bring young women and girls into the world of politics and business. Jessica is a very passionate and inspirational speaker (similar to Teresa Tomassoni from Fair Girls, if you remember.)

Jessica will be accompanied by **Kate C. Farrar**, vice president of **AAUW Campus Leadership Programs**, presenting the AAUW program, **Elect Her**, with which Running Start has been partnered since 2009. The Elect Her program is designed to increase the pipeline of women running for elected office in college and beyond and is operating at 50 colleges and universities in 27 states, the District of Columbia, and Jamaica. A 2014 **NCCWSL** (National Conference for College Women Student Leaders www.nccwsl.org) attendee and scholarship recipient has been invited to attend. This year our branch will contribute to NCCWSL scholarships through AAUW Funds.

MEET OUR PROGRAM SPEAKERS



Jessica Grounds has devoted her life to empowering women to become political leaders. She has worked in the campaign, nonprofit, and private sectors. Jessica's previous positions include Executive Director of Running Start, the national non-profit she co-founded; Senior Vice President of the political consulting firm Stones' Phones; and the President of Women Under Forty Political Action Committee. She continues

to serve on the Board of Directors for both WUFPAC and Running Start. Jessica was recently elected as Co-Chair of Running Start's Board. She is also the founder and principal strategist of Solid Grounds Strategy, a consulting firm developing strategy for female political candidates and women's organizations.

Jessica is currently the Director of Women Ready for Hillary. Ready for Hillary is a grassroots organization building a massive network of supporters encouraging Hillary Clinton to run for president in 2016.

Jessica is an expert on campaign strategy, how to build political networks, the challenges facing women seeking elected office, with particular expertise about young women candidates. She frequently speaks domestically and around the world about the importance of increasing the number of women we have serving us in elected office. Her most recent international trips have taken her to speak in: Panama, Ireland, Northern Ireland, Tajikistan and Belgium. She recently joined the ONE Campaign for a political delegation to Rwanda.

- Messaging to women voters
- Integrating family in your campaign
- Voter targeting strategies
- Campaign budget
- Finance and fundraising strategies
- Understanding and overcoming the unique challenges for young women candidates





Kate C. Farrar, vice president of AAUW Campus Leadership Programs, manages programs that ensure college women assume leadership roles and acquire the skills they need to succeed in their academic, professional, and personal lives. Prior to assuming her current position, Kate was the associate director of National Programs and Policy at Wider Opportunities for Women. She was a 2011 WIN Young Woman of Achievement awardee, member of the Center for Progressive Leadership's 2011



Executive Fellowship, and serves on the board of the Women under 40 Political Action Committee (WUFPAC). Her writing has been featured in the *Huffington Post* and the *Daily Muse*. Prior to arriving in Washington, D.C., Kate lobbied the Connecticut state legislature on behalf of nonprofit organizations. She also served as a field organizer in Wisconsin for the 2004 presidential campaign. She earned a bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Connecticut and a master's in public administration from the Maxwell School at Syracuse University.


