

# Board Meeting AAUW Mt. Vernon Branch January 6, 2015

- 1. Co-president Mary Ellen Mehler called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. Present were Bartlett, Clark, Crane, Daugherty, Krebs, Lonoff, Mehler, Quick, and Richey.
- 2. Minutes of the December meeting were approved as amended.
- 3. **Treasurer's report**: There is a balance of \$6,596.44 at this time. The \$50 donation to the Wildlife Conservancy has been made, Mt. Vernon Country Club was paid \$991.74 for the December luncheon \$960 was collected from participants and the branch paid a \$31.74 shortfall for this event-, \$2700 was sent to AAUW Funds and Mary Ellen Mehler was reimbursed \$94.47 for the purchase of AAUW mugs for speakers gifts.
- 4. **AAUW Funds update**: The total branch donation for September 1 to December 9, 2014 was \$3,460 --\$560 for the Legal Advocacy Fund and \$2900 for the Educational Opportunities Fund. Individual donations from branch members directly to National for the period Jan. 1 to August 30, 2014 totaled \$310, giving a grand total of \$3770.
- 5. **January monthly meeting plans**: The venue for this has been changed to the Government Center. Shirley will start the telephone tree, Mary Ellen will email the Alexandria Branch to invite them, and members are asked to invite high school and college aged children for this program.
- 6. **Nominations for Co-president, Co-program and Treasurer:** We hope to get new people involved. Several names were suggested and we will contact anyone we think of and get back to Lois Passman or Mary Ellen.
- 7. **Plans for Gerry Hyland's Town Meeting on January 31**: For our table at this meeting, Mary Ellen and Patsy have banners, handouts and AAUW mints. Joanna suggested putting out wrapped chocolates as well.
- 8. **February 19<sup>th</sup> Monthly Meeting**: This will be on Container Gardening and the speaker, Eileen Powell, will have copies of her book for sale. It will be a PowerPoint presentation aided by Paul Mehler. Joanne and Patsy volunteered to bring refreshments due to Cathy Krebs' absence at that time.
- 9. **Dr. Kristy Collins on STEM grant**: Mary Ellen reported that she got the verification of our 501(c)(4) status for Dr. Collins. Dr. Collins will submit the proposal to National by the deadline of January 15.
- 10. "From Vision to Reality: Mission Possible": The board agreed that the March Annual Meeting would be a good time to have Jeanne Elmore introduce this project to our membership.

#### 11. Additional Items:

- a. District Meeting is January 17. Joanne Clark is compiling a list of our best programs to present. She will email them for the board's consideration.
- b. Public Policy Chair: The board decided we may not need a chair for this. Patsy can forward information to Bianca, who will include it in the Newsletter.
- c. Speakers' Gifts Mary Ellen showed us the mugs that will be used.
- d. Lobby Day is February 4, in Richmond. If you can go and want to carpool, call Patsy Quick.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

Our Lobby Day activities will start at 8:30 a.m. when we attend the League of Women Voters of Virginia's Legislative Roundtable. We will then meet with the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and the Speaker's Chief of Staff. All will receive copies of our signed petition and hear about our other legislative priorities. Our group will then fan out so each of us can visit our respective senators and delegates. Following this, we will split into two groups—one going into the Senate Gallery and the other into the House Gallery, where we will be introduced.


