

Log in with your **Member ID** and **password**. If you do not remember your **Member ID** there is help to retrieve it or simply contact Edie Bartlett (redsse@aol.com). If this is your first time logging in, you will need to register first. Enter Member ID and they will ask you to put in a password. (Write this information down in your notebook so you will know where to look for it next year.)

Follow down the left side to "renew membership" and follow the directions.

- YOU MAY ALSO PAY BY CHECK. Make your check in the amount of \$90 payable to Mt. Vernon AAUW and mail it or give it to Trish Smith or Edie Bartlett.
- YOUR PROFILE ON MSD:

Your profile gives your information, plus any donations you made for the year 2014. This will be helpful if you itemize on your income tax. Remember that \$46 of National dues are tax deductible on itemized returns.

AAUW STATE AND NATIONAL ELECTION

There are two important AAUW elections coming up this spring: AAUW National and AAUW of Virginia.

Electronic voting for **AAUW National** will be open from **April 15 until June 19**. You will need your member ID and voter PIN, which you will find on the back cover of the Spring/Summer Outlook magazine.

You will vote for candidates for the **AAUW Board of Di**rectors, bylaw amendments, and the proposed Public Policy Program.

You may also vote by paper ballot. Paper ballots have to be requested between April 1 and May 8.
