2015 Accomplishments Herald 2016 Growth

With 2015 coming to a close, I was inspired to look back at what types of public policy

achievements AAUW's members nationwide had accomplished for women and girls this year. I was impressed with what I found:

• We awarded more than \$3.7 million in fellowships and grants to 241 women during the 2015–16 academic year.

• We tackled the gender pay gap on a bigger scale than ever before, by launching the AAUW Work Smart salary negotiation program in Boston, which will train more than 85,000 women by 2020.

• We fought to keep students safe from harassment and assault in classrooms and on campus by pushing for enforceable regulations for the Campus SaVE Act.

• We continued to bring women and girls into STEM fields through our AAUW National Tech Trek Program, AAUW National

Tech Savvy Program, and acclaimed Solving the Equation: The Variables for Women's Success in Engineering and Computing research report.



We can be very proud of the 2015 accomplishments of our organization! Looking forward, in 2016, one of AAUW's most important priorities will be preparing for the November election.

AAUW is ramping up its election work to help young women understand what's at stake and why their votes matter. Many Mount Vernon Branch members have enjoyed participating in voter education and registration in the past year. We have a solid core of trained volunteers, and we are looking to grow. Let's continue to be active in this important AAUW Public Policy effort in 2016!

HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS DAY

Write a Letter to the Editor (LTE)

Last year many branches in Virginia engaged in activities to increase awareness of the epidemic of human trafficking. These activities included connecting with local organizations assisting survivors of human trafficking, advocating for human trafficking legislation, meeting with public officials and lawmakers, presenting programs concerning human trafficking, collecting signatures for our human trafficking petition, and having six Letters To The Editor (LTEs) published in newspapers and news outlets around the Commonwealth, i.e. *Sun Gazette, Fairfax Times, Daily News Record, The Virginian-Pilot, Alexandria Times*, and *Alexandrianews.org.*



Thanks to our advocacy efforts and those of other organizations and individuals, in a show of bipartisanship, our General Assembly passed a human trafficking bill during the last session. This was a HUGE step forward, and we hope that we are able to build on this foundation and see legislation introduced in the upcoming 2016 General Assembly Session to address assistance to survivors of human trafficking. Stay tuned!

The state board has once again identified LTEs among our goals and priorities for 2015-2016. January 11, 2016, is Human Trafficking Awareness Day, which is only two days before the 2016 Virginia General Assembly Session convenes. Once again, this presents a unique opportunity for us to draw public attention to human trafficking and to the need for the General Assembly to pass legislation to provide assistance to survivors by writing LTEs. Although it's not too early to start writing an LTE, you shouldn't submit any to newspapers until early January.

By nature, **LTEs** are **short** so it won't take long to write one. Here's some how-to information on writing **LTEs**: <u>http://www.aauw.org/resource/how-to-write-a-letter-to-the-editor/</u>. Also, the research has been done for you. Take your pick of information to include in your LTEs from AAUW resources: <u>http://www.aauw.org/resource/quick-facts-on-human-trafficking/</u>; <u>http://www.aauw.org/2013/11/15/human-trafficking</u>, and <u>http://www.aauw.org/what-we-do/public-policy/aauw-issues/human-trafficking</u>.
