

MT VERNON BRANCH OF AAUW ADOPTS THE EARLY LEARNING CENTER OF UCM CLAUDIA CREO

The Board and the staff of UCM are extremely grateful and excited that the **AAUW Mt Vernon Branch** has "adopted" the **Early Learning Center.** As many of you know, UCM (United Community Ministries) a secular charitable organization, provides various services for the less fortunate in our community, especially families and children.

For thirty years, UCM has operated the **Early Learning Center** (formerly know as the BEL Center) for children living at or below the poverty level with the overarching goal of breaking the intergenerational cycle of poverty. They work to ensure that all early learners enter kindergarten with the requisite knowledge, skills, and resources to succeed both personally and academically.

The students range in age from six weeks to five years and engage in activities that foster their cognitive, linguistic, social-emotional, and physical development. The Center is located at 2709 Popkins Lane, Alexandria, Virginia, 22306.

Visiting is an amazing experience.

As you might imagine, despite the generous contributions that support many of the needed services that UCM provides, there is so much more the **ELC** needs to accomplish these goals.

While the exact definition of "adopting" is not clear, I have included a "wish list" (from least expensive to most expensive) that might provide a starting point to determine what we could do to help.



- * First and foremost, the ELC needs classroom volunteers. Volunteer shifts are from four hours to staying for the full day. The ELC operates from 7:00 AM until 6:00PM.
- Children's Art Materials (white paper, colored paper, drawing and construction paper, washable school glue, washable paint, chubby markers, chubby pencils, chubby colored pencils, painting smocks etc.)
- * Literacy Tools: (children's books of variety in subject, Infant and Toddler board books, preschool ages 3 to 5 books) Please no commercial books such as Dora, Sponge Bob, Sesame Street, Mickey Mouse, etc..
- Gardening Materials for Children: (edible and nonpoisonous seeds for planting, small gardening gloves, children's gardening tools).
- New cots for Early Preschool, Toddlers and Pre-K.
- * Infant strollers (5).
- * Classroom area rugs.
- Infant evacuation cribs (4).
- Playground equipment and playground pressure washing.

GUN CONTROL FILM AND PANEL. OCTOBER 27

See a free community screening of UNDER THE GUN followed by a panel discussion starting at 7 pm in the McLean Community Center theater, 1234 Ingleside Ave, McLean.

This event is presented by the Fairfax Area and Falls Church
Leagues of Women Voters
and the Fairfax County Council of PTAs.

UNDER THE GUN, executive produced and narrated by **Katie Couric** and directed by **Stephanie Soechtig**, examines why lawmakers have yet to take meaningful action, despite the increase in gun-related fatalities and the public's outpouring of shock and outrage that comes with them. What is keeping the two sides of this debate - those favoring strengthening our gun laws and those, like the NRA, viewing the Second Amendment as conferring gun ownership rights to individuals - from finding common

ground? The film offers a quick history lesson using a timeline that's enriched with news headlines and archive footage, showing how gun violence prevention and legislation have evolved since **Martin Luther King Jr**. and the **Kennedy brothers** were shot. The broader history is blended with the impact of gun violence told through the lens of families impacted by **mass shootings in Newtown, Aurora, Isla Vista, Tucson and Chicago**.

"I've covered mass shootings and gun violence throughout my career, but following the massacre at Sandy Hook, I was confused by the disconnect between public opinion (over 90 percent of Americans supported universal background checks) and public policy," film narrator **Katie Couric** said in a statement. "I hope this film will help people have a better understanding of how we got to this point."

A panel discussion will follow the screening at 9 pm. The panel will include **Matt Bennett**, a founder of "Third Way," a DC based centrist think tank. Matt has worked toward gun violence prevention since the Columbine mass shooting. He served as an advisor to the Sandy Hook families after Newtown and is widely recognized for his expertise on the politics and challenges within the gun debate.
