

SPOTLIGHT:

Nevada becomes the 36th state to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment!

On March 22, Nevada became the 36th state to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment, 45 years to the day after it was passed by Congress and sent to the states. Senate Majority Leader Aaron Ford (D-Las Vegas) noted the bill as "long overdue," and Sen. Pat Spearman (D-Las Vegas), who introduced the resolution, emphasized that the bill is "about equality, period." The ERA first passed Congress in 1972, and was last approved by a state—Indiana—in 1977. The amendment fell three states short of being adopted into law nationwide by Congress' arbitrary deadline. Nevada's overdue ratification has reignited interest in the ERA; this week, groups across the country told stories of why women still need the ERA in order to highlight that this issue still matters.
