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# PRESIDENTS' CORNER

On May 8, AAUW will decide which legendary woman will be our nominee for a commemorative US postage stamp? AAUW has been conducting a poll among members asking

assistance in choosing among five candidates to nominate for the honor. I just completed my ballot (with difficulty because all five candidates are deserving).

Since 1893, various women have been portrayed on U.S. postage stamps, starting first with **Queen Isabella of Spain** and ending this year with civil rights activist

**Dorothy Height**. A number of the women honored on stamps have been associated with AAUW in various ways.

It is always gratifying to see women's contribution acknowledged in this way because visibility is an important reminder of all the ways women contribute to our complex society. This year we will see **Harriet Tubman** portrayed on the front of the \$20 bill. She will be the first woman to appear on any US paper currency since the 1800's when **Martha Washington** and **Pocahontas** appeared on paper certificates that are now out of use. Soon, also, the redesigned \$5 and \$10 bills will have the faces of famous women.

The five women in the postal stamp poll are:

- Dorothy Ferebee –an early advocate for women and civil rights
  - Ellen Swallow Richards—one of AAUW's two co-founders and first US woman to obtain a chemistry degree
  - Flemmie Kittrell—global ambassador and pioneer in nutrition and child development
  - Jeanette Rankin—first women elected to congress (R-MT); famous for her statement, "I may be the first woman member of Congress, but I won't be the last."
- Edith Green—(D-OR) served 20 years in Congress; instrumental in passing Title IX and Equal Pay Acts

AAUW is a powerful advocate for women's issues of all kinds. Maintaining visibility for the organization and for women with projects such as this is a significant contribution. Members may vote in the poll by going to AAUW's web site.
