

### From Weeds to Perennial Flowers, Annuals and Herbs by Elaine Kolish



On May 10, **Mary Ellen Mehler** and **Elaine Kolish** began the refurbishment of UCM's Early Learning Center garden. This is a project the branch has endorsed as part of being a **"Friend of the ELC."** 

The enclosure and raised bed had been built by Eagle Scouts several years ago, but had deteriorated into weeds, despite the presence of landscaping fabric. After weeding extensively, we planted perennials donated by **Mary Ellen**, **Elaine** and **Joanna** 

Crane from their gardens, and some pole beans from Kathryn Prigmore.

We also purchased petunias and dahlias and additional herbs, such as chocolate mint, which would be fun for the children to sniff. In addition, we planted lambs ear around the edges which the children will enjoy touching. For the path around the garden we laid down rubber mulch, which curtails weeds and supposedly lasts ten years (this mulching is not yet completed). The plantings will get a heavy dose of shredded mulch, which will break down and improve the soil over time. While it looks wilted now, our watering and recent rains should revive the plants nicely.

#### FROM AAUW'S LISA MAATZ IN A RECENT WASHINGTON UPDATE



what goes on behind the

scenes each week as
AAUW's staff works on your
behalf? Here's a little glimpse
at our legislative, field, and
media efforts in 2017 thus far.

As of the end of April, AAUW's

Public Policy staff was monitoring around 40 different bills in the 115th Congress that fall within AAUW's member-approved Public Policy Program. In that time frame our staff conducted around 800 different interactions with Capitol Hill staff — including meetings, correspondence, and visits from the AAUW Action Fund Capitol Hill Lobby Corps — to ensure AAUW members have a consistent, respected presence in the halls of Congress. You can see the fruits of our labor in the over 20 floor statements from members of the 115th Congress that mention AAUW by name. AAUW also joined over 65 sign-on letters to Congress and the administration on legislation and policy recommendations; this is a big increase over past Congresses.

Reinforcing those efforts, **AAUW** members and supporters received 29 federal Action Networks from our staff so far this year, and in turn, you sent an impressive 63,972 messages to legislators. In fact, the AAUW Action Network is seeing record growth in 2017, with more individuals joining the list this year than did in all of 2016 combined! AAUW policy staff

were also featured at state conventions in Indiana, New Mexico, and Pennsylvania.

Whew! And we're just getting started! Our state legislative work is also rocking and rolling, so be sure to subscribe to <u>AAUW In the Statehouse</u> to learn more about the activities of AAUW members across the country! In the next edition, we'll provide a similar glimpse behind the scenes of our state work. Don't forget to follow us on social media while you're at it. In 2017 thus far, <u>@AAUWPolicy</u> gained 935 new followers and earns, on average, 8,500 impressions a day. Our annual Equal Pay Day Twitterstorm saw a huge influx in participation with 21,500 people engaging in 2017 compared to 2,400 in 2016. AAUW policy staff also appeared in 437 media outlets talking about AAUW policy priorities which resulted in a potential reach of 97.6 million people!
