



The SIMPLE TRUTH about the Gender Pay Gap

We have all heard that men are paid more than women are paid over their lifetimes. But what does that mean? Are women paid less because they choose lower-paying jobs? Is it because more women work part time than men do? Or is it because women have more caregiving responsibilities? And what, exactly, does gender bias have to do with paychecks?

Recently new statistics came out about the gender pay gap in our country. AAUW updates its research booklet, **The SIMPLE TRUTH about the Gender Pay Gap**, each year based on the new statistics. This current report succinctly addresses these issues by going beyond the widely reported 80 percent statistic.

The current report (with the newly released 2016 data) explains the pay gap in





the United States; how it affects women of all ages, races, and education levels; and what you can do to close it. In 2016, for the fifth anniversary of *The Simple Truth*, AAUW updated the report with information on disability status, sexual orientation, and gender identity.

According to the report, in 2016, women working full time in the United States typically were paid just 80 percent of what men were paid, a gap of 20 percent? The gap has narrowed since the 1970s, due largely to women's progress in education and workforce participation and to men's wages rising at a slower rate. Still, the pay gap does not appear likely to go away on its own. At the rate of change between 1960 and 2016, women are expected to reach pay equity with men in 2059. But even that slow progress has stalled in recent years. If change continues at the slower rate seen since 2001, women will not reach pay equity with men until 2119.

Here are some quick facts:

- According to AAUW, the pay gap won't close until 2119.
- There isn't just a gender pay gap, there is a racial pay gap.
- Women in every state experience the pay gap, but in some states it's worse than others.
- In 2016 the pay gap was smallest in New York, where women working full time year-round were paid 89 percent of what men were paid.
- The largest gap was in Louisiana, where women were paid 70 percent of what men were paid.
- In 2016, median annual earnings for men in Virginia were \$55,817 compared to \$44,798 for women
 — an earnings ratio of just 80 percent, or 23rd out of all states and the District of Columbia. The
 gap is worse for most women of color and moms. As efforts stall at the federal level, states can
 enact legislation to help women and families at the local level.
