to introduce both Work Smart and Start Smart, AAUW's pay **WORK SMART** negotiation seminar for graduating seniors, as a first

step to implement these seminars in Northern Virginia and throughout our Commonwealth. Working with Trinity University as a host partner, they offered an AAUW Work Smart seminar in

Join us for a look back at the struggle of Women's Suffrage Includes film, lecture, Q and As, and museum tour.

At 11:00 AM on Saturday, February 24, we will meet at the infamous Lorton Workhouse Museum, Building 9, which women the right to vote. is part of the larger complex of Lorton Arts Center. We will be treated to a short film, then a speaker and a brief tour of the prison.

The film, "Night of Terror" depicts what took place on November 14, 1917, at the Occoquan Workhouse prison. On that day, 33 suffragists from the National Women's Party were arrested for demonstrating outside the White House to demand their right to vote. News of their beatings and torture at the Lorton prison horrified the pubic and furthered support for the Women's Suffrage Movement.

Three years later the 19th Amendment to the Constitution was ratified, giving
