

The AAUW National Board of Directors has voted to put three proposals for bylaws amendments before the membership for a vote this spring.

Here are the three proposed amendments:





- The Board of Directors strongly supports allowing up to 5 directors who are not members of AAUW to serve on the board. Wording of the proposal:
 The Board of Directors shall be comprised of fifteen directors with a minimum of ten individual AAUW members and no more than five non-members.
- 3. The Board of Directors strongly supports **removing the degree requirement for membership in AAUW.**

<u>Online Voting Period:</u> April 25 to June 9, 2018 (paper ballots have to be requested between April 16 and May 7)
