

NORTHERN DISTRICT MEETING REPORT

The combined Mt. Vernon branch and Northern District AAUW meeting was held on October 20. The Mt. Vernon branch was represented by **Bianca Daugherty**, **Paula Lettice**, **Joanne Malkin**, **Mary Ellen Mehler**, and **Patsy Quick**.

Caroline Pickens of the McLean Area branch updated participants on **AAUW's new strategic plan** with its four focus areas, which she referred to as "Four Pillars" that are needed to advance the lives of today's women. These are (1) Education and Training, (2) Economic Security, (3) Leadership, and (4) Governance and Sustainability.

Two of the meeting speakers, **Sue Christie** and **Chioma Eni**, spoke about AAUW's current central initiative, **StartSmart/WorkSmart**, which addresses the issue of pay inequity. **Chioma Eni**, a **StartSmart** facilitator from the Arlington branch, shared her personal story and described her challenges in salary negotiations.

Brian Cannon, director of *One Virginia 2021 - Virginians for Fair Redistricting* also spoke to the group. The *One Virginia 2021* organization is working to stop gerrymandering. He described the ongoing efforts in Virginia and demonstrated how reform was handled in other states.



Bragging on Branches — AAUW National to AAUW MEMBERSHIP MATTERS Facilitate Two Work Smart Sessions at Virginia's for MVPs, presidents, and finance officers Women's Conference

AAUW National is thrilled to be facilitating two Work Smart sessions at the Virginia Women's Conference sponsored by U.S. Senator Mark Warner (D-Va.) on Saturday, November 17 at the Hotel Roanoke and Conference Center. The conference hosts about 800 women annually, and this year AAUW will hold two Work Smart workshops that will reach about 200 – 400 women! The organizers were inspired to offer the sessions after learning about them through AAUW of Virginia conference participants and recent press on the Work Smart initiatives in AAUW Boston and AAUW Massachusetts. AAUW National appreciates AAUW of Virginia's strong support and is engaged in ongoing conversations with the offices of both Senator Warner and Governor Ralph Northam (D) about building a state-wide initiative in Virginia. National efforts continue to engage partners to advance the reach of Work Smart.

BUILDING MONUMENTS DEDICATED TO WOMEN

The role of women in our nation's history has gone unheralded for too long. Fortunately, there is greater movement to herald and document those roles played by so many and memorials are being constructed.



One will be just down the road within the new cultural area of the Occoquan Regional Park. The Turning Point Suffragist Memorial will also be near the Workhouse Arts Center, located at the former Lorton Prison site where many suffragists were incarcerated. There is currently an exhibit at the Workhouse Arts Center that many of us visited as a branch event this past February. Funds are needed to build the memorial. The other is in Richmond on Capitol Square. This "Voices from the Garden" monument will feature 12 statues of women who represent 400 years of Virginia history, ranging from the Jamestown period through the 20th century. Much of the funding to construct the monument itself as well as some of the 12 statutes has been raised, but additional funding is still required. To learn more about the monument, please visit
