OUT ON THE TOWN



The **National Women's History Museum** was founded in 1996 and currently curates online exhibitions and provides educational materials for schools. It has a variety of programs, particularly walking tours in the Washington, DC area. On Saturday, September 8th, **Mary Ellen Mehler**, **Anne Simpson, and Paula Lettice** went on the "**Women of Alexandria Civil War**" walking tour in Old Town, visiting many historic sites that still survive and learning about women who served in medical capacities at a time when medicine was considered men's work and how many women supported both the Union and Confederate causes.

The Museum maintains a presence online through social media and a comprehensive website which hosts many online exhibits where visitors can learn about the history of American women. The website also serves as a platform to promote NWHM's mission and generate support.

In December 2014, the Congress voted to create a congressional commission to study the creation of a National Women's History Museum.




