



BRANCH PROGRAM JANUARY 19

Dr. Jamie Grant, a certified **Transcendental Meditation (TM) trainer and director of the TM Center in Fairfax**, enlightened a group of twenty-eight Branch members and friends at Heritage Presbyterian Church on Saturday, January 19, 2019.

His talk, **"Don't Forget** Your MEDS, An Introduction to the Importance of Medita-

tion," was supported by videos, charts, and statistics. "MEDS" in the title does not refer to medications but refers to the four components of wellness: Meditation, Exercise, Diet, and Sleep. Transcendental Meditation, or TM, is a simple, effortless, natural, mental technique. It is not a form of religion or worship and does not involve mind control, or focused concentration.

Dr. Grant compared the active mind experiencing stress to an ocean with waves at the top while at the deepest levels of both mind and ocean

year-olds shows improved cognitive flexibility in the elderly after TM.

Planting a plant in soil and feeding and watering it benefits not only the roots but the whole plant. TM grounding benefits not just our minds but our

whole lives. Therefore, TM is very relevant in schools. A video showed students meditating in a middle school in a rough neighborhood of San Francisco. In students, TM develops alertness, focus, creativity and self-confidence. It gets the students ready to learn. It also makes them faster at video games! School administrators found that with TM psychological distress and anxiety of students went down and their academic performance and attendance went up.

How can TM technique be learned? Phase I consists of four 90-minute classes on four consecutive days. Phase II features follow-up 60-minute meetings, two in the first month after Phase I, and one meeting per month for the next three months.


