

An active member of industry associations, **Mary** was a member of the Board of Directors of the Association for



## Women Hurt Most by Student Loan Crisis

#### In the most recent AAUW Mission & Action newsletter you read:

When women take the stage to get their diplomas this spring, they'll be graduating to staggering debt. As of early 2019, women hold almost two-thirds (\$929 billion) of the country's \$1.46-trillion student debt, according to <u>a new analysis</u> of AAUW's report <u>Deeper in Debt: Women and Student Loans.</u>

"Sadly, as women graduate, they are already at a significant financial disadvantage, with higher debt and lower pay in their first jobs than men," says **Kim Churches**, CEO of AAUW.

Meanwhile, the Class of '19 is the most racially and ethnically diverse U.S. college student body ever — and women comprise a growing majority of students. Women earned 57% of bachelor's degrees in 2019.

"Despite all the advances women have made in education, they still face a pay gap from the moment they graduate," says **Churches**.

#### How can you help?

AAUW is encouraging all of its members, supporters, and friends to register for **Work Smart** and to take the program online. And to help reach the bold goal of getting 10 million women trained in salary negotiation by 2022, AAUW issued **a "Members Mobilize a Million"** challenge, asking everyone to <u>share the course with</u> at least 20 people in their network.

Take the **Work Smart** negotiation course, yourself, and spread the word.!

"We're so proud of Work Smart Online, a training tool we created with funding from the Coca-Cola Foundation and other important partners," **says Churches**.
