Solveig will talk about *Strong Female Protagonists* and her book <u>Sigga of Reykjavik</u>. Sigga, a feisty fish woman, seeks dignity and independence in the gritty era before Iceland's feminist revolution. She struggles against a backdrop of economic depression, which gives way to the free flow of money, when Iceland is occupied by Allied soldiers during World War II. How does Sigga cope with the joys and dangers that nearly 50,000 good-looking Allied soldiers with money in their pockets and a penchant for good times pose for the sparsely populated island?





After years of advocacy, Virginia ratified the Equal Rights Amendment on January 27th. Now everyone is invited to Celebrate!38 on March 8th, International Women's Day!

Celebrate!38 is a grand celebration of equality that will include speakers, live music, a parade, and a photo session on the steps of the Virginia State Capitol to record the historic moment. During the parade we will tell the story of equal rights through four distinct eras:

1920 - 19th Amendment / women's suffrage

1970 - Title IX

2020 - Virginia's ratification

Future - when we add the ERA to the Constitution

Each section tells a story with banners, parade puppets, and participants and each theme has a recommended color wave (more information available here). Organizations are welcome to pick an era that represents their organization's efforts (or multiple eras) and are encouraged to bring signs / banners for their organization. Children are particularly encouraged to be in the last (Future) wave since kids are the very best of America and our future. Athletic teams are encouraged to dress in uniform and join the Title IX section. Participants from other states and national groups are encouraged to join the Future wave with their state flag or organizational banner.
