It is time to vote again! Virginia Town Elections will occur on **May 4** in Clarke County, **Fairfax County**, Shenandoah County, and Washington County. At time of this publication, voters in Virginia Town Elections must have registered previously, since the registration for Town Elections was April 12.

Democratic and Republican Primary Elections will be held on **June 8.** Virginia voters can vote in either party's primary, but not both. **Deadline for new registrations and updating of an existing registration is May 17.**

Voting absentee in person or by mail, as well as in-person on Election Day, are all available options for voting in these elections.




SUCCESSFUL PROGRAM YEAR!


October 15, 2020 - Impossible Odds - Meet Author Jessica Buchanan






April 17, 2021 - Author talk: Bob Levey

Letters sent to elected officials urging immediate action on COVID relief, paid leave benefits, voter access and other key AAUW public policy


New learning community launched: AAUW's Equity Network offers leadership training to early- and mid-career participants who are committed to social justice.
