

- Bettina Lawton, Vice Chair, Fairfax Co Electoral Board, will address the status of voting legislation and rights in Virginia.

- ⇒ Who are the Watchdog Groups and what are they doing?

If you have not paid your dues for 2021-2022, the time is getting short.

AAUW dues were due June 30.

DO YOU HAVE AN IDEA TO PROMOTE EQUALITY FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS?

If you have an idea for a project that would fit the AAUW National or AAUW-VA public policy priority, please forward your suggestion to any of our branch board members. Such a proposal may qualify for a mini-grant funded by AAUW-VA. The state board has voted to make a total of \$2000 available this year for mini-grants, which will be awarded in amounts of \$50 to \$500 each.

An article in the Summer 2021 *Vision* announced the program. If you have questions or concerns about a prospective proposal, you may contact our state Co-VP for Public Policy, **Denise Murden**, at denise.m.murden@gmail.com.

Branches are encouraged to collaborate on a project and apply in a single application. Projects may have started as early as July 1, 2021, and funds must be expended by June 30, 2022. **The hard-and-fast dead-line for submission of the grant proposal is September 15, 2021.** The project topic may be anything that addresses the national or state public policy agenda of promoting equality for women and girls.

Chris DeRosa—Chapter Leader, Spread the Vote


Chris is a long-time resident of Arlington. She earned a Bachelor's Degree in Education from the University of Hawaii and a Master's Degree in Education from the University of Oregon. She taught for over 20 years in Fairfax County Public Schools as a special education teacher.

After retiring from Fairfax County Public Schools in 2006, she began a private tutoring business in Falls Church and began a "new" life as a volunteer to "give back" to her community.

Since 2017, Chris has served as leader of the Spread the Vote/Project ID's Arlington/ Falls Church chapter, which strives to help people register to vote, request the restoration of their voting rights, and obtain their DMV IDs and DLs – most of their clients are homeless neighbors.

Sue Worden—Alexandria League of Women Voters

Sue has been a member of the League of Women Voters since 1974, first in Massachusetts and since 1986 here in Virginia as a member of the League of Women Voters of the Fairfax Area. She has served as Voter Service Chair both for her local Massachusetts league and for Fairfax. She also served for 2 terms as the Voter Service Chair for the Virginia state League. During that time she co-chaired with AARP Virginia several state-wide television candidate debates for both governor and US Senate.

DINING OUT AT "CHEZ PAULA"




