


GET YOUR TICKETS FOR BRIGHT STAR


A warm welcome to our newest member Jacque Brewer.

DIVERSITY OUTREACH GROUP


Explore Equity and Inclusion with the Diversity Outreach Group

At its November meeting, the Diversity Outreach Group watched and discussed the Red Table Talk episode: **"The Racial Divide: Women of Color & White Women."** The program features Jada Pinkett Smith, her daughter Willow, and mother Gammy – three generations of women who have candid conversations about the most important and provocative topics of the day. The group may view other episodes of Red Table Talk on similar topics that address diversity in the future.

Please note that the **AAUW National's Inclusion and Equity Committee's webinar on Thursday**, **December 2, at 4 p.m. is** *Creating Inclusive Spaces* and will address how spaces are created where all parties feel welcome, appreciate, respected and heard. **Register** <u>here</u>.

When the Diversity Outreach Group meets on **Wednesday, December 8**, the discussion on <u>Me and</u> <u>White Supremacy</u>, the book written by Layla F. Saad, will continue. The group is reading the sections from Day 8 through Day 14, pages 77 – 123. In this second week of the book, the topics include Color Blindness, Anti-Blackness, Racist Stereotypes and Cultural Appropriation. In addition to reading the book, the members of the group are participating in reflective journaling on each day's readings.

PUBLIC POLICY UPDATE FROM DENISE MURDEN, STATE PUBLIC POLICY CO-VP

AAUW-VA members can be proud of our efforts to get out the vote this year. A historic number of Virginia voters turned out for an "off-year election," and **Virginia elected the first woman to the office of Lieutenant Governor in Virginia's 400-year legislative history.**

Our Public Policy Co-VPs will send emails to every newly elected and re-elected Virginia delegate. The emails introduce AAUW-VA and our legislative priorities and offer our assistance in research and advocacy. Branches and individual members are encouraged to reach out to local Delegates to offer congratulations and support and to inform them of the issues you are advocating.

AAUW-VA continues to collaborate with the *Virginians for Paid Sick Leave (VPSL)* coalition and the *Campaign for a Family Friendly Economy Virginia* as advocates for **paid sick days and paid family and medical leave.** AAUW members are encouraged to visit the websites of these organizations to stay informed on actions and updates.
