

<u>2022 Primary Candidates</u> include Republican primaries in Congressional Districts 2, 3, 6, and 7, and a Democratic primary in D8. There are no primaries in Congressional Districts 1, 4, 5, 9, 10, and 11. There are also city council primary elections in Manassas and Roanoke.

Redistricting following the results of the census resulted in voting district changes throughout Virginia. This primary election will be the first to reflect those changes. To determine how and if your district has changed, visit <u>https://www.vpap.org/redistricting/</u> and type in your address.
