

Holly has lobbied extensively at the local, state and federal level. She taught the first class on animal law at her alma mater, The College of William and Mary. She formerly served as Legislative Director for Virginia Delegate Kaye Kory.

**Holly Hazard** has been an advocate for children's issues for over 25 years first serving as PTA President ateach of the three Fairfax County public schools her children attended. Recently she co-founded the grassroots activist organization, <u>4 Public Education</u>, to promote and protect public education.

She also edits a daily blog, <u>theosborneman.com</u>, on the hundreds of love letters sent home by her great-grandfather between 1901 and 1940.

On October 15, AAUW Mt. Vernon Branch, partnered with Sherwood Hall Regional Library, conducted a successful program entitled "**The STEM Gap: How Can We Build a Better Future for Girls and Women?**" Our AAUW research indicates "The Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) fields will account for some of the fastest growing — and highest paying jobs of the future. Yet girls and women are still not on par with boys and men in





preparing for or entering into these fields."

Our speaker, **Kathi Hanrahan**, currently serves on two non-profit boards including serving as Women in Technology Board Member at Large for Emerging Leaders. Her program focused on educating and inspiring young women from middle school to early career. She introduced us to the Girls in Technology organization and shared a long list of resources that we will post on our website She concluded by giving us ideas for how parents, teachers, and grandparents can influence girls. The program was so successful and timely that we will record the program and make it available to local groups. 
