Our newest member, **Melissa Joy Thiel**, MD, will explain and demonstrate some of the ways in which women can harness their own deep energy source by tapping into the energy that pervades the universe. Melissa worked as an obstetrician/gynecologist for many decades in Alexandria.

The latest findings by quantum physicists on energy flow in the universe and our own interconnectedness matter for our daily lives and how we wield our own power to make the world a better place.

Here's how Melissa puts it:

"Most often we view ourselves as primarily physical beings. Rarely are we educated and trained to identify,

optimize and use our 'energy body' for maximum benefit. Let's share this opportunity to begin to understand and experience some fun, amazing, and powerful aspects of our energetic body and presence."

A helpful source for understanding how energy flow and connectedness relates to us is the book *The Field: The Quest for the Secret Force of the Universe* by Lynne McTaggart. Based in quantum physics theory, the book offers findings of scientists such as Albert Einstein, Max Planck, Hal Puthoff, and Niels Bohr, to explain the inexplicable—how there's no such thing as empty space, how energy flows through the universe, and why it matters for our technological world as well as for our personal lives.

This is an <u>important election</u> for <u>voting rights</u>, <u>reproductive freedom</u>, and <u>education</u>. And it could be a bellwether for 2024. On the ballot will be:

- All 40 seats of the Virginia State Senate;
- All 100 seats of the Virginia House of Delegates;
- Many local offices, including some school boards.

Studies indicate that in the areas where postcards and phone calls about voting have been received voting numbers increased. Our efforts are worthwhile!

"Women Going the Extra Mile" – August 2023 Mt. Vernon AAUW Members Participate!

Our nation's centuries-old journey for women's equality continued from Alexandria, Virginia this August as Alexandria Celebrates Women (ACW) leads the way.

ACW Vice President **Gayle Converse** led "Women Going the Extra Mile" – a 133-mile trek from Alexandria to Richmond to raise awareness for many of the issues women face.

"We are walking for women's equality – in health care, at the ballot box and everywhere else. We honor women and girls of today and throughout history who have broken tradition, social norms, glass ceilings and *gone the extra mile*," explains Converse.

Walkers followed the East Coast Greenway <u>East Coast Greenway - Home</u> from Alexandria City to Mount Vernon, next proceeding to Occoquan Regional Park – home to the <u>Turning Point Suffragist Memorial</u>.

The journey ended on August 26, 2023 (Women's Equality Day) at the <u>Virginia Women's Monument</u> on Capital Square in Richmond.

Seven Mt. Vernon AAUW members, **Bianca Daugherty**, **Elaine Kolish**, **Paula Lettice**, **Mary Ellen Mehler**, **Ofelia Perotti**, **Patsy Quick**, **and Anu Soi**, met **Gayle Converse** as she approached the grounds of Mt. Vernon from the Mt. Vernon Trail. Anu and Ofelia walked about a mile to meet Gayle on the trail. They came up to the trailhead arm in arm with her. We all walked the rest of the way to the Mt. Vernon Circle where two women from the DAR joined us. We distributed bottles of water with AAUW labels and encouraged Gayle as she continued on her journey to Richmond. The Greater Richmond branch greeted her there. *Many thanks to our members who came out on August 5 for this unique event*.

They were called "communists" by segregation supporters.

A new play *Wednesdays in Mississippi* dramatizes the little known activism of an inter-racial alliance of women who fought for civil rights in the South in 1964. Enraged at the exclusion of women from the 1963 March on Washington, **Dorothy Height**, director of The National Council of Negro Women, invited Northern women to join Mississippi women to struggle for voting rights, to support the Freedom Schools, and to aid the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party.

The "Wednesdays in Mississippi" coalition, which included the AAUW and the League of Women Voters, formed the only women's civil rights project led by a national organization.

Written by **Nicole Burton**, *Wednesdays in Mississippi* is produced by Pipeline Playwrights. Burton adapted the play for the stage from **Debbie Z. Harwell's** awardwinning book by the same title. The November 11 performance will include post-show discussions. AAUW members faced violence to fight for civil rights in 1964 Freedom Summer in Mississippi!

Who are the Pipeline Playwrights?

Pipeline Playwrights strives to break through the glass ceiling women face in the American theater when they try to get their plays produced. The group of five midcareer women playwrights aims to close the theatre gender gap one play, one reading, one production at a time.

Pipeline Playwrights is based in Fairfax County, Virginia, and the digital world.

In 2018, Pipeline Playwrights launched "Our Time, Our Stories," a multi-year project to produce five new fulllength plays. After the pandemic hit, Pipeline quickly pivoted to Zoom and presented dozens of online readings and events, including a full production of the first play in the "Our Time, Our Stories" series, Ann Timmons' *A Very Present Presence*. In 2022, Pipeline began producing live plays again (*Heartland* by Patricia Connelly and *Unprotected* by Jean Koppen) but is committed to continuing to serve audience members unable to attend live theater because of disability, caregiving responsibilities, or economics.

Affirm the Equal Rights Amendment!

It has been 100 years since the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) was first introduced in Congress.

While the advancement of women's equality has continued incrementally through patchwork legislation and court decisions, we have seen in the past year how women's equality under law can be changed or even revoked at the whim of legislators and judges. In July 2023, a new joint resolution **ERA Now** (H.J. Res. 82) was introduced in Congress to affirm the ERA and direct the Archivist of the United States to certify and publish the Equal Rights Amendment as the 28th Amendment of the United States Constitution.

Women in the United States have waited long enough for the ERA to be fully codified. We cannot wait for equality any longer. To contact your members of Congress and urge them to affirm the Equal Rights Amendment <u>click here</u> or go to <u>https://www.aauw.org/act/two-minute-activist/</u>

Get-Out-the-Vote (GOTV) Postcard Writing June 3, 2023

Mt. Vernon AAUW has participated in the GOTV writing of postcards for several years. The purpose is to send hand-written postcards to targeted populations encouraging voter turnout. Does it work? Is it effective? Yes! The data was analyzed in 2022 and showed there was a measurable lift in voter turnout in districts where postcards were sent. (Ask Patsy to show you the study.) To that end, seven of our branch members gathered at Patsy Quick's home on June 3 and wrote 80 postcards to mail to a district in Tidewater Virginia. They

had fun decorating the cards with stars and various colors of pens to make the cards friendly and eye-catching, and then added postage stamps that matched the locale.

Many thanks go to **Bianca Daugherty, Kathi Hanrahan, Mary Ellen Mehler, Ofelia Perotti, Louise Priest, Liz Promen, and Patsy Quick** for their time and efforts. It was a fun morning and every little bit we can do helps the cause.
