

Preparations for the AAUW-VA Lobby Days is underway. A room has been secured at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Richmond for our Women Legislator's reception on January 30 at 5 p.m. We will be working with the Greater Richmond Area Branch members on this event. A block of 18 rooms has been reserved at the Hampton Inn, Richmond at a group rate of \$149 each. This is the same hotel as last year. In person lobbying will be on January 31 and the details for virtual lobbying on February 28 are being worked on. Issues for lobbying will depend on what is introduced by the newly elected members of the legislature after the election but will reflect our policy priorities.

<u>Voter Guides for the 37 contested Virginia Senate Races</u> were completed, shared with individual candidates, and posted on the AAUW-VA website prior to the start of early voting. AAUW National recognized Virginia for this effort.


IMPROMPTEVENT

AAUW members faced violence to fight for civil rights in 1964 Freedom Summer in Mississippi!

They were called "communists" by segregation supporters.

A new play, **Wednesdays in Mississippi**, dramatizes the little-known activism of an interracial alliance of women who fought for civil rights in the South in 1964. Enraged at the exclusion of women from the 1963 March on Washington, Dorothy Height, director of The National Council of Negro Women, invited Northern women to join

Mississippi women to struggle for voting rights, to support the Freedom Schools, and to aid the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party.

The "Wednesdays in Mississippi" coalition, which included the AAUW and the League of Women Voters, formed the only women's civil rights project led by a national organization.

Written by Nicole Burton, Wednesdays in Mississippi is produced by Pipeline Playwrights. Burton adapted the play for the stage from Debbie Z. Harwell's award-winning book of the same title. The November 11 performance will include a post-show discussion.

Who are the Pipeline Playwrights?

Pipeline Playwrights strives to break through the glass ceiling women face in American theater when they try to get their plays produced. The group of five mid-career women playwrights aims to close the theatre gender gap one play, one reading, one production at a time.

Pipeline Playwrights is based in Fairfax County, Virginia, and the digital world.
