#### **AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS:**

- Our bylaws have been updated with mandatory changes by National that did not require a vote.
- We will discuss and vote on a proposed change regarding officer terms. That information was published in an email to branch members on February 24, 2024. This is the language below:

Section 3. Terms of Office.

a. Terms of Office. Elected and appointed officers and directors shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors have been elected or appointed and have assumed office. No elected officer shall hold the same office for more than three consecutive terms. Despite the expiraration of three consecutive terms, an officer continues to serve until a successor is elected. No officer shall hold more than one office, elected or appointed, at any given time.

This change requires a vote of the membership.



# **WELCOME OUR NEW MEMBER**





Before her career at J&J, Susan held several positions at the Advanced Medical Technology Association (AdvaMed) where she was responsible for regulatory and reimbursement issues affecting the medical technology industry. She also served in the federal government including the Department of Health and Human Services, where she was Acting General Counsel among other positions; the Department of Housing and Urban Development; and the Small Business Administration. She practiced law in Oswego, New York, and served as Counsel to the School District.

Susan earned her Bachelor of Arts, *magna cum laude*, in International Relations from Syracuse University and her Juris Doctor from Syracuse University College of Law, where she served on the Law Review and was published. She is the recipient of several awards including "Team of the Year" awards for APEC and CETA. She also received the W. Quinn Jordan Memorial Award for significant government affairs accomplishments benefiting transfusion medicine and the Food and Drug Administration Commissioner's Special Citation.

Susan is an emeritus member of the Board of Advisors for the Syracuse College of Law and serves as the Chair of the D.C. Regional Council for Syracuse University. She is a member of the Board of Mount Vernon at Home, an organization that facilitates "aging in place" for seniors.



#### Just in time for Cherry Blossom Season in Washington, DC.!



 Diana Parsell, author and member of the AAUW McLean Area Branch, will introduce us to Eliza Scidmore, the Early AAUW Member Behind Washington's Cherry Blossoms.

As Diana's book reveals, Scidmore was an extraordinary journalist and travel writer who got her start as a newspaper correspondent in Gilded Age Washington in the 1870s. She wrote authoritative books on Alaska, Japan, Java, China and India; was an activist in the burgeoning U.S. conservation movement, in association with major figures like John Muir; and was the most influential female at the early National Geographic, as the first woman elected to the board (in 1892) and to publish photographs in the magazine. In 1920, Scidmore became an AAUW member. Copies of the book will be available for sale.


