


OUR SPEAKER:

o mark Virginia AAUW's 100th anniversary, every branch is asked to donate 100 items or 100 dollars to a local non-profit or to AAUW's funds. Our board decided to donate to United Community, a local poverty-fighting non-profit. Weekly, the UC's Food Pantry puts together bags of food and other supplies that are delivered to its homebound clients. The "other supplies" include personal toiletries, such as shampoo, soap, dental care products, and adult diapers. These needed items are always in short supply. Consequently, the Mount Vernon Branch members were asked to bring donations of full-size toiletry items to our holiday luncheon in December.

The result was a resounding success. **We collected over 232 items**, including 72 soaps, 40 toothpastes, and 78 adult diapers, which are among the homebound clients' most requested items. The staff at UC expressed surprise at the number of donations and sincere gratitude for the generosity of our members.
